Viadrina seeks to fill a tenured position at the full professor level and with German civil service status with all corresponding benefits. Estimated position salary is currently about € 100.000 per year. A higher salary may sometimes be offered when necessary to meet competitive conditions.

### POSITION DESCRIPTION

The Faculty of Social and Cultural Sciences invites applications for a tenured position at the rank of Full Professor in Ukrainian Studies.

The successful candidate shall focus on Ukrainian studies (19<sup>th</sup>-21<sup>st</sup> century) in a transnational and a global context through their teaching, research, and the transfer of knowledge. We are seeking candidates who will develop the field in an internationally visible manner, participate in national and international research collaborations, and contribute to further establishing the Viadrina as a leading center for Ukrainian studies worldwide. The position plays a pivotal role in developing the institutional structures of interdisciplinary research on Eastern Europe and Ukraine at Viadrina, assuming both leadership and management responsibilities.

The successful candidate will be required to have the following qualifications:

- an innovative research profile that aligns with Viadrina's profile
- outstanding expertise in cultural, historical, political or social sciences in the field of Ukrainian studies (19<sup>th</sup>-21<sup>st</sup> century with a focus on contemporary questions), indicated by a relevant habilitation or equivalent achievements (e.g. second book)
- a broad publication record in internationally recognized academic outlets
- proven university-level teaching experience
- success in securing competitively awarded third-party research funding
- strong proven leadership, management and social skills
- very good knowledge of Ukrainian and good command of other relevant languages (e.g. Russian or Polish)

Additionally, the following skills are desired:

- experience in participating in interdisciplinary projects and/or study programs
- the ability to prepare research and teaching materials for a general audience and develop innovative ways of presenting academic results.

The successful candidate will teach predominantly in English. Candidates should have or acquire German proficiency at a level sufficient to also teach in German. A good level of German proficiency should be acquired within two years of the appointment.

## QUALIFICATIONS

Position qualifications reflect the requirements of § 43 of the Brandenburg Higher Education Act (Brandenburgisches Hochschulgesetz, BbgHG), and include: University degree, pedagogical suitability, strong aptitude for scholarly work, usually demonstrated by the quality of a doctorate (PhD), and additional scholarly achievements, such as a habilitation or equivalent achievements (e.g. a second book), and comprehensive expertise in research management, particularly in areas with high levels of third-party funding or significant personnel responsibility.
