W3 Professorship for Business Administration, in particular Management and Innovation (m/f/d/x)

to be filled by 1 October 2027.

The professorship is expected to strengthen teaching and research in the field of Management and Innovation and to contribute to the university's profile, with a focus on Europe and digital transformation.

The ideal candidate is expected to:

- have a distinct research focus at the interface of organization, technology, and innovation, with a substantive emphasis on organizational innovation processes, digital transformation, or artificial intelligence in business contexts,
- have an outstanding and broad publication record in top-tier international journals in the field of Management and Innovation, based on conceptual and qualitative empirical research,
- have profound expertise in qualitative empirical research,
- demonstrate the willingness and ability to engage in interdisciplinary research, in particular at the interfaces with sociology, political science, and cultural studies, as well as international research experience and a broad network of academic cooperation partners,
- be able to teach Management and Innovation at the Bachelor's and Master's level as well as at the doctoral level in the degree programmes of the Faculty of Business Administration and Economics in both German and English, combined with a willingness to develop and apply innovative teaching methods and, where appropriate, new study programmes,
- have experience in applying for and conducting externally funded projects,
- be able to transfer research findings into practice.

The following is non-essential, but considered an advantage:

- willingness to involve practitioners in teaching,
- willingness to actively contribute to interdisciplinary projects and degree programmes,
- interest in cooperating with colleagues from Central and Eastern Europe,
- gender and diversity competence in research and teaching.

The call for applications addresses academics who fulfil the requirements according to § 43 of the Brandenburg Higher Education Law (Brandenburgisches Hochschulgesetz, BbgHG). The professorship is permanent.
