#### Why participate?

This Winter School offers a unique academic and practical experience, combining online lectures with field activities in Cyprus. It is an extraordinary opportunity to:

- deepen your understanding of legal, political, and human rights issues in territorial conflicts;
- work in international teams with students from partner universities;
- gain direct experience through negotiation and moot court simulations;
- visit key sites of the Cyprus division, such as the UN buffer zone in Nicosia and the closed district of Varosha in Famagusta;
- develop advanced skills in public international law, applied to real-world cases.

#### **Program structure**

### 1. Online module (October 2025 – 8 academic hours)

Four interactive lectures introducing fundamental concepts:

- Contested territories and the principles of sovereignty, self-determination, and territorial integrity.
- Occupation and state responsibility under international law.
- ECtHR jurisprudence in territorial conflicts.
- Mechanisms of dispute resolution and international legal remedies.

## 2. On-site module in Cyprus (1–7 November 2025 – 22 academic hours)

- Paphos: historical introduction and legal mapping of the Cyprus conflict.
- Nicosia: visit to the divided capital and the UN buffer zone.
- Famagusta (Varosha): workshop on property restitution and protection of cultural heritage.
- Paphos: multilateral negotiation simulation.
- Paphos: moot court based on a fictional case before the ECtHR or ICJ.

#### **Assessment and credits**

Students will be assessed through:

- group portfolio,
- performance in simulations,
- active participation,
- final individual report.

Successful completion awards 4 ECTS credits.

## **Admission requirements**

- Good knowledge of public international law.
- Minimum B2 level of English.
