SHORT	Mental health in academia requires urgent attention, especially		
DESCRIPTION	post-Covid-19. Research shows that early career researchers		
	(ECRs) face severe mental health challenges due to steep		
	hierarchies, power imbalances, relentless pressure to publish and		
	secure funding, and intense job competition. These conditions		
	often lead to anxiety, depression, or burnout. While universities		
	offer mental health support, it is often framed within a neoliberal logic—treating well-being as an individual responsibility rather		
	than addressing systemic issues. This shifts the burden onto ECRs		
	instead of tackling structural problems within academia. This		
	keynote challenges the individualization of mental health struggles		
	by highlighting the systemic issues shaping them. It critically		
	examines dominant beliefs around productivity, performance, and		
	excellence while opening space for reflection, exchange, and		
	intervention—above all, a space where ECRs feel validated and		
	supported.
