Conservation in England and the role of English Heritage

The historic environment in England is amongst the richest and most varied in Europe, and it is here that the concept of conservation as we know it today had its roots in the late 19th century. After over 100 years of development, English laws for protecting the historic environment are sophisticated and well developed. The formation of English Heritage as a semi-autonomous organisation has created a unique expert national body to advise the government on England's historic environment.

In a series of three lectures, the development of the conservation movement in England and its current legacy will be explored, ranging from the first attempts at legislation in the 1880s to the current system. The role of English Heritage will be explained, and its work in London will be illustrated through current case studies.

The lectures will be held in English, but there will be an opportunity for questions and discussion in German.
