Furthermore, it is a pleasure to announce that we have just been assigned a study on employee financial participation (EFP) for the European Parliament.

Currently, we are finalising two studies concerning EFP: at the German level for the Hans Böckler Foundation on the impact of employee share holding in SMEs—addressed to workers’ representatives—and at the European level for CEEP focusing on enterprises providing services of general interest.

We are half way through a project for the German-Polish Science Foundation aiming at developing national models of

leveraged employee buyouts in SMEs in both countries, based on the Anglo-American ESOP model.

Also, we keep working on issues of **legal reform in transition economies**, in particular **Central Asia**, and in the emerging democracies of **North Africa**.

We look forward to continuing existing co-operation and taking new opportunities.
